PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

Plaintiffs bring this action to challenge the invidious discrimination fostbred in the State of Michigan by law and practice against persons under 18 years of age who seek political office. Such discrimination exists by statute to prevent any person under 18 years of age, regardless of his or her qualifications or ability, from being a candidate for public office. Such discrimination works a particular hardship against minors, such as the named individual Plaintiff herein, who wish to sit on Boards of Education which oversee the very public institutions—schools—directly affecting their present and future lives.

This discrimination against youth not only denies them the equal protection of the laws, but frustrates the attempts of adults and adult-led political parties which advocate youth gaining greater control over their own lives and institutions. It serves to deny First Amendment rights to such organizations as the Human Rights Party of Ann Arbor which seeks deliberately in some instances to have its positions articulated and presented by persons under 18 years of age. For example, the Human Rights Party of Ann Arbor has adopted in its official platform that the State Age of Majority be lowered to 14 years of age; attempts to convey the validity of its position by presenting articulate.
