CBD - May possess Anti-Anxiety & Anti-Psychotic Properties (anti insomnia)

Contaminants - Bacteria - to Check For - Mold, Pesticides

- 143 ?? - In general Patients will experience the therapeutic effect on the first trial dose. ??
- Most intense about 20 min after inhale
- 144 - No medicine is needed to treat a person who gets too much THC.
- 145 - Goal - Reduce Risk by determining the lowest effective dose.
- Get Maximum level of THC in blood by holding breath 10 seconds
- Most of the THC is lost in the burning and "side stream smoke"
- 146 CBD (and CBN) Block the excitant effect of THC

- Smoking Advantage is Ease of Titration - Autotitration
- 148 Smoking often can be as needed, or before meals, or every 4 hours - for glaucoma, spasticity, seizure disorders
- 150 Store in opaque containers, sealed, in dark cool place or freezer
