

YOUTH LIBERATION

Youth Liberation (YL), of 2007 Washtenaw Avenue, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48104 [313/769-1442], is planning a conference on high school organizing in the Michigan/Ohio area [with the location being kept under wraps] for March 24.

The Washtenaw Avenue address is the home of David Kaimowitz, 13, a leader of YL and an "organizer" of the Tappan Junior High Student Union. On January 28, David Kaimowitz, whose father is an attorney with the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), the student union, his mother and "all others similarly situated" filed a class action suit in Washtenaw Circuit Court seeking \$16,000 in damages from a Tappan assistant principal for alleged assault and battery. The suit also meaks injunctive relief "to force school authorities from forcibly or otherwise restraining the Tappan Student Union from exercising its legitimgte right to assemble."

Kalmowitz claims that on January 21, while The was urging students to attend a union meeting [unauthorized by the school], he was punched and knocked to the floor by an assistant principal, Duane Peterson.

The Tappan Student Union [which claims 60 members out of a school enrollment of 1,100] is a part of Youth Liberation, an Ann Arobr based group with grandice national pretenses. YL has a 15 point program and a new mimeographed paper, Youth Rising: "the paper is devoted to the people who are forced by our society to go to prison daily; namely school. Ne feel that it is important to us and to the revolution that we get oursleves together and unite against the system."

YL has absorbed, if not taken over, CHIPS, the Cooperative Highschool Independent Press Syndicate [an underground newspaper exchange] and PPS, originally F*** Public School, now Freedom, Peace and Solidarity, [a youth news service], both the concept of John Schaller.

A recent but undated issue of FPS [from its content published in December, 1971] states that CHIPS and FPS have become "services" of YL, and list the 2007 Washtenaw address as their new mailing address. In this issue of FPS, YL materials are listed and include Now to Start a High School Underground, Major Court Decisions Regarding the Rights of Students and Youth, and the School-stoppers Textbook.

HOTE: School-stoppers Textbook was not published until January, 1972, and commences with "intorduction to the Third Attempt" in which it is stated that two previous attempts to publish were frustrated by sponsoring groups changing their minds. The introduction continues, "So now it is being distributed and printed by a few people, independently of any existing groups."

The material in the textbook, intended for "people who want to fight back against their school,"consists of 61 suggested ways to disrupt and destroy high school life. Some of the suggestions are incitements to crime - stealing, hurning and destroying school property.

NOTE: A copy of School-stoppers Textbook is available on file. As a forewarning to parents and educators, Rep. John Ashbrook, terming it an "evil pamphlet," had the text entered into the Congressional Record - E299, 1/20/72.

Radical sources indicate that copies of School-stoppers can be obtained from Charles Ream, 25, whose address [1018 Church Street, Ann Arbor] is listed in the pamphlet as the distribution center. A "Chuck" Ream is listed as a member of the collective publishing Youth Rising.

THE RNA ELEVEN

Seven members of the Republic of New Africa (RNA) are being held in Hinds County Jail, Jackson, Mississippi, four other RNA members have been released on their own bond awaiting a March trial date. The eleven were arrested last August 18, after a shootout with law enforcement personnel in which Lt. Skinner of the Jackson police was killed, a police officer and an FBI agent wounded.

RNA president Imari Abukakari Obadele I [Richard Henry] and his ten followers have been charged with murder, levying war against the State of Mississippi, assault and battery with intent to kill, and receiving stolen property.

Among the pre-trial motions filed is one asking that the indictments be quashed on the ground that the house where the arrests took place was "the residence mission of the RNA [and] is a soverign nation on the above territory." A second motion claims the court lacks jurisdiction because "this case concerns a controversy between a state and officials of a foreign nation."

With such fantasy in the court it is hardly surprising that the inevitable defense fund is known as "The New Africa Prisoner-of-War Fund." Its address is c/o Attorney William Miller, 1040 Dalton Street, Jackson, Mississippi.

It has not been possible to establish what currency should be sent to the RNA Eleven.
