DeMoCo was chosen because it was in late August when 300 women impates staged a sit-down strike to protest the induman conditions at the jail. Decaking at the rally will be TMM SATU, from New York's Prisoner's Bolidarity Committee, Attica Regotiator, also speaking will be representatives from the Black Fanther Farty, The Malcon I Center of Inketer, and a manuar of the National Welfare Hights Organization.

Most of the demonstrators parked their cars on Five Mi. Just W. of Sheldon Mi. and walked or were shuttled to the rally joint at the MM corner of Five Mile and Beck where the speakers talked before marching to in front of the Womens Division for a time then they marched to in front of the main buildings. They marched in circles there along with shouting and chanting to the immate trusties in the rear area of the buildings. They started leaving area at 4:15 M. No incidents, no arrests.
